Cathy is a university department head in a Maritime city. She is the mother of three school-age children. She speaks of the insecurity she experiences because of unpredictable day care arrangements - and of the reflection of the same difficulty in the work of her married students: "They don't work as creatively as they could."

"The idea is still fairly prevalent that the woman's place is in the home... If she has to go out to work, or if she chooses to go out to work, that's alright providing she does both."

Questions to ask ourselves:

Why do so many people still think women must choose between a family and a career?

Why are many of us less understanding of the problems of working mothers who aren't poor?

When Cathy has some time off we show her sailing a boat. Would it have been different if we'd shown her working on a manuscript for a book?

Why does domestic work have so little prestige? Motherhood is probably the most time-honored profession. Why is it not equally honorable to work as a replacement of a mother?
